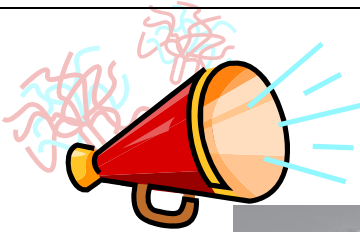


Cambria Historical Society Speaker Series Featuring Author Clark Colahan

“Lovina Dart: Letters Home from an Eloquent Pioneer on San Simeon Creek”



Clark will share letters and stories about one of his favorite ancestors. Granddaughter of a judge, daughter of merchant parents and in-law of four members of congress who founded the Lincoln Republican party, Lovina homesteaded in 1858 on San Simeon Creek with her husband and two siblings. Clearly well-educated like her brother E.A. Clark, pioneer doctor, fruit grower and school teacher in the north county, she wrote expressive and often touching letters full of observations about what she encountered daily.
